## ORDER GRANTING MOTIONS TO DISMISS WITH PREJUDICE

THIS CAUSE was considered by the Court upon Defendants' Motion to Dismiss Plaintiffs'
Amended Complaint and upon Intervenors'/Defendants' Motion to Dismiss Amended Complaint.
Having considered the motions, the memoranda in support and in opposition, the pleadings, and being otherwise fully advised in the premises, the Court finds and rules as follows:

- Plaintiff initiated this action on July 16, 2014, challenging the constitutionality of Chapter
   2014-184, Laws of Florida, as an alleged violation of the single subject requirement of
   Article III, section 6 of the Florida Constitution.
- 2. The initial complaint was dismissed after motion and hearing by Order Granting Motion to Dismiss entered on October 7, 2014. The Court ruled that Plaintiff failed to meet the special injury allegations necessary to confer standing to challenge the law in question.
- The initial Plaintiff, joined by additional Plaintiffs, filed an Amended Complaint for Declaratory Judgment on October 21, 2014.

Defendants and Intervenors both filed their respective motions to dismiss on November 5,
 2014.

 The Court issued an Order to Show Cause to Defendants and to Intervenors on November 20, 2014.

 Plaintiff filed its Opposition to Defendants' Motion to Dismiss Amended Complaint on December 22, 2014.

7. In order to sustain standing, the Plaintiffs are required to allege sufficient facts to support a finding of special injury. As currently pled, the Amended Complaint for Declaratory Judgment also fails to allege a legally sufficient basis to sustain a finding of special injury and the Court is of the opinion that further amendments to the complaint will not result in a legally sufficient complaint.

It is therefore **ORDERED** and **ADJUDGED** that the respective motions to dismiss the Amended Complaint for Declaratory Judgment are granted with prejudice, and the Amended Complaint for Declaratory Judgment is **DISMISSED** with prejudice.
